

CPC30620 – Certificate III in Painting and Decorating

To obtain a painter's license in Queensland you will need to complete CPC30620 Certificate III Painting and Decorating, and a Business Management Course.

This is the nationally recognised qualification for painters and can be obtained by completing an apprenticeship, or by a skills assessment called Recognition of Prior Learning. This qualification provides a trade outcome in painting and decorating for residential and commercial construction work.

Occupational fields:

- Painter
- Decorator

The qualification has core unit of competency requirements that cover common skills for the construction industry, as well as two specialist fields of work. The construction industry strongly affirms that training and assessment leading to recognition of skills must be undertaken in a real or very closely simulated workplace environment and this qualification requires all units of competency to be delivered in this context.

Who is this course for?

The CPC30620 Certificate III in Painting and Decorating is for new and existing workers who are currently employed in a relevant position and wanting to work toward completing the qualification.

- 1. Current workers operating in the painting and decorating industry either on residential and commercial construction sites
- 2. Who want or require formal qualifications to obtain a license to work in the painting and decorating industry as a 'Painter and Decorator'
- 3. Where this work is undertaken either as employees or contractors (sub)

These workers will:

- Be currently employed and consequently have access to an operative work site and all
- resources required to undertake their work functions (and the training).

As students these workers will:

- Be currently working so will require on-work site training.
- Be looking to have their previous and current skills and knowledge recognised i.e. CT & RPL (see below) with remaining skills and knowledge trained and assessed on site through gap training.





Entry requirements

Students will be required to successfully complete a language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) assessment prior to enrolment.

Students will need to provide their own workplace safety clothes and shoes. All other resources will be supplied by the employer or sourced by the RTO.

Course duration

The course is structured to be delivered over 27 months however students can take up to 3 years if necessary.

Training methods

Delivery is through a combination of face to face, onsite training in a supervised workplace. Learners are also required to undertake self-paced learning.

Completion of the general construction induction training program, specified in the Safe Work Australia model Code of Practice: Construction Work, is required by anyone carrying out construction work. Achievement of CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry meets this requirement.

Amount of Training

Monthly training site visits will occur or on yard site owned by Noble Training Group located in Gold Coast and Sunshine Coast if needed.

Assessment

This course is delivered through on-site assessment where our assessors come and visit you on your job site. Some units of competency require written theory assessments as well. You will be assessed to show that you have achieved the skills and knowledge required.

You will know in advance about the type of assessment and how it will operate. There is opportunity for reassessment and appeal, which can be found in the Student Handbook.

Location

All training occurs in the workplace under the supervision of a workplace supervisor. This may be your employer or a nominated person. The supervisor liaises with the trainer/assessor. All work-based (practical assessment) takes place in the workplace and any theoretical assessments may occur offsite.





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Outcome

Upon successful completion of this training product, you will be awarded a nationally recognised qualification in CPC30620 Certificate III in Painting and Decorating.

What is recognition of prior learning?

Recognition assessment is a process that allows you to attain a nationally recognised qualification or statement/s of attainment, based on skills and knowledge gained through previous experience, either formal training or informal (i.e., on the job) learning. Personal protective equipment (PPE)

All students will require following items:

- protective eyewear: Clear safety glasses, (tinted or sunglasses not acceptable). These must conform to the Australian Standard AS 1336 or 1337.
- protective footwear Safety Toe, Leather Upper, non-slip safety footwear must be worn. They must comply with AS2210 and be in good condition.
- protective clothing Sleeved, 100% cotton work wear or employer supplied uniform must be worn always.

Note: Additional specialist protective clothing/personal protective equipment may be required for certain activities. This will be identified by Safety Signage and instruction from your employer and/or






trainer. Students failing to meet these minimum standards of dress will not be permitted.
